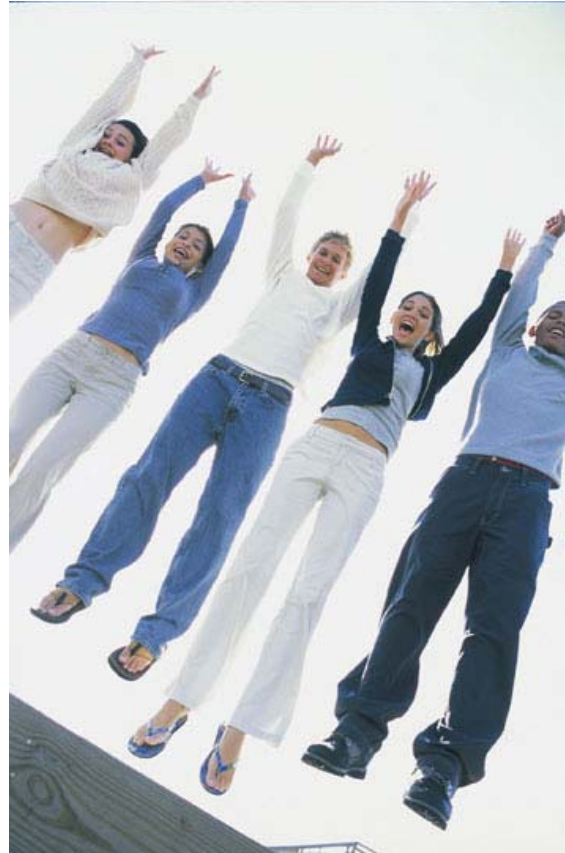

The Syracuse Community Service Project (CSP) allocates funding for services that are designed to prevent teen pregnancy and provide essential services for teens who are already pregnant or parenting.

The CSP Steering Committee is responsible for all decision making regarding assessment, planning, allocation of funds, and selection of service providers and the lead agency.

These programs are funded under the Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention and Services (APPS) Act.
